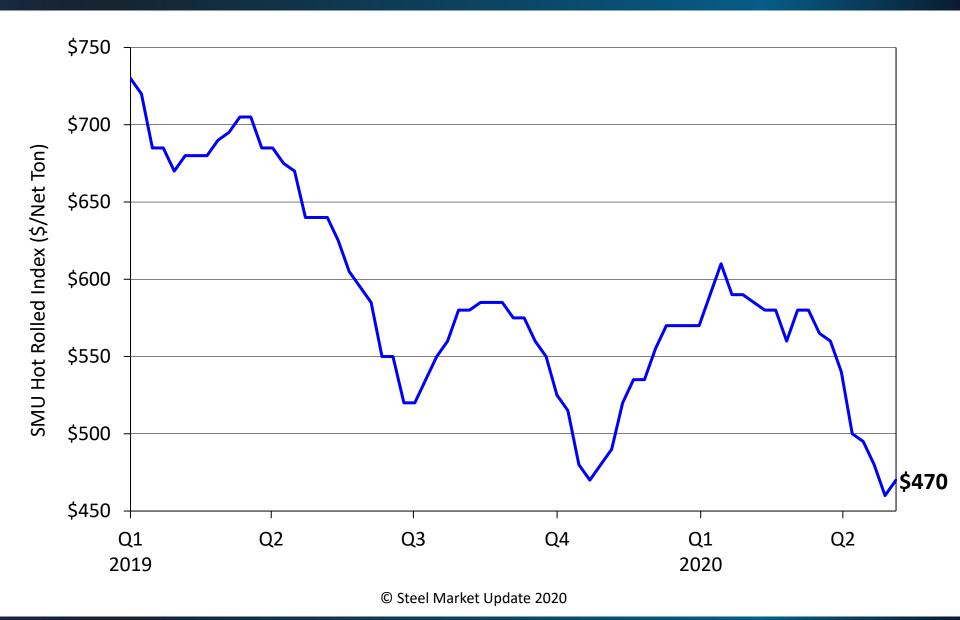

SMU Hot Rolled Price Index

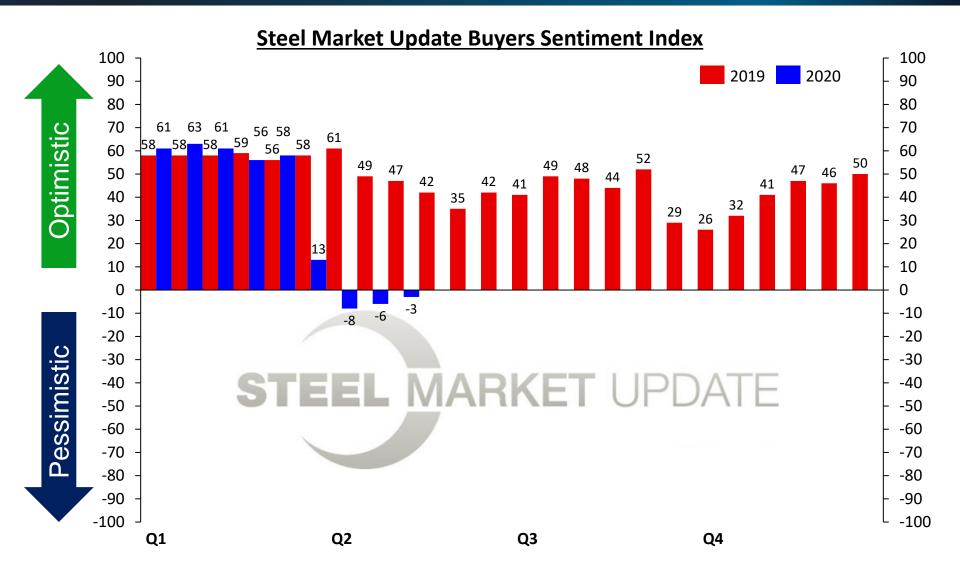




SMU Buyers Sentiment Index



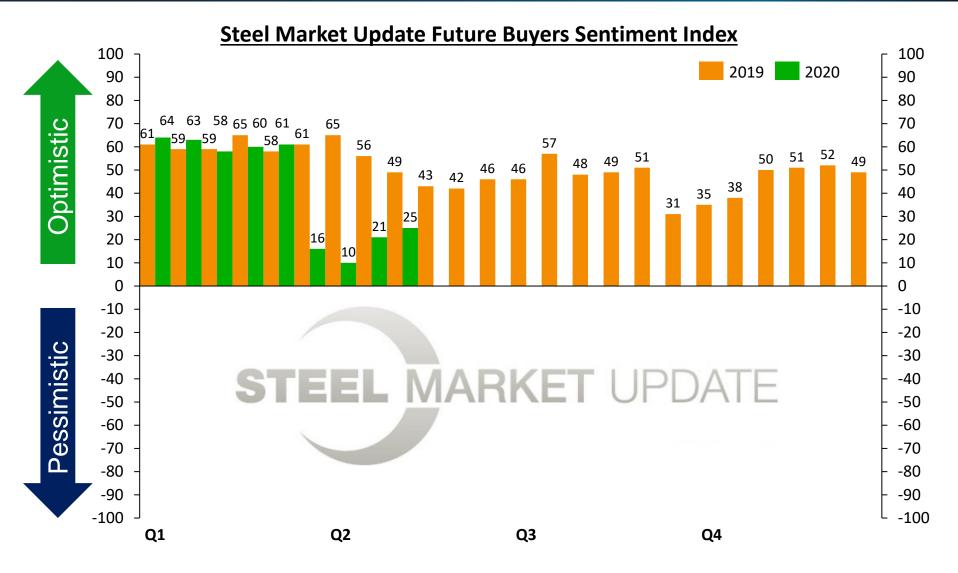

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No smooth sailing for U.S. steel post COVID-19

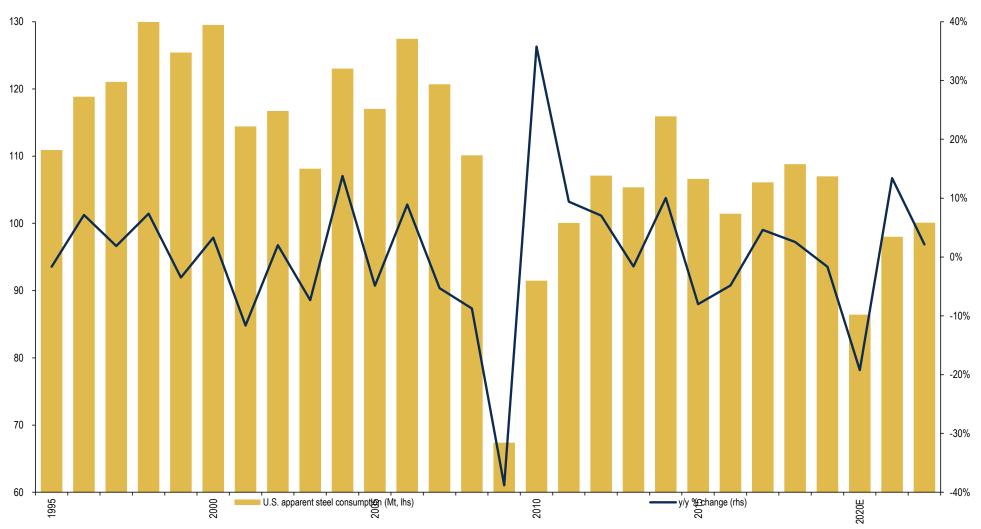


- Bank of America economists anticipate a Q2E/Q3E global recession
- Energy and auto impaired, even when activity resumes
- Construction leading indicators rolling over (per Ken and others)
- Recoveries tend to take several years
- Couple lower demand with 5 new/expanding sheet/plate mills
- Steelmageddon™ is worse than we thought if demand lower, UNLESS many blast furnaces stay shut

What do past cycles tell us? No V-shaped recovery

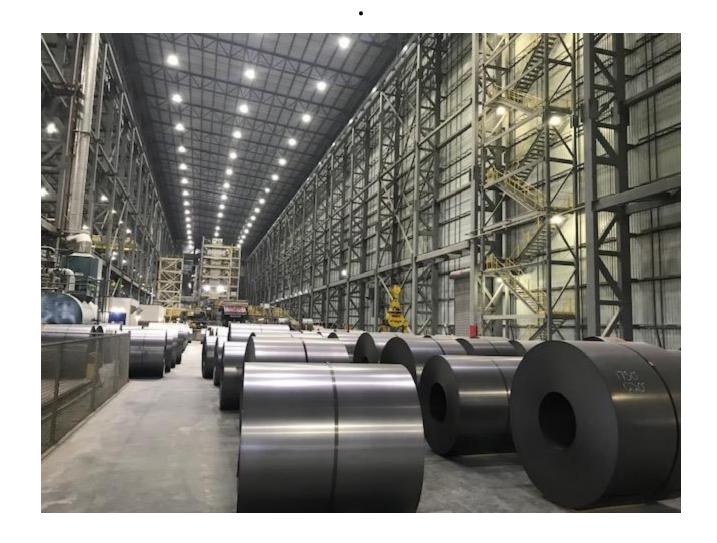
